Citizen's Academy

Commercial Avenue Pedestrian improvements project Update

Legacy Underground Construction, the City's contractor, has begun work on the Commercial Avenue Pedestrian Improvements Project. Efforts will be made to keep traffic flowing throughout construction.

As a reminder, residents are asked to slow down in this area and allow plenty of space for the contractors to safely complete this work.



Commercial Avenue Overlay Project

Commercial Avenue will be overlaid this fall. The City has already selected a contractor for the overlay work, but we have requested that the contractor wait until the sidewalk project is completed before beginning the overlay.

Lake Sampling

Concerns have been expressed about taste and odor issues in our treated water. Following discussion of these concerns, staff recommended, and the Board approved a Lake Sampling program with HDR to examine the composition of Smithville Lake to determine what may be causing these concerns and how we can improve our water quality. Sampling began in April. Information gained to date provides a snapshot of data and will assist in review as we proceed through the year. At this point, data does not show any concerning trends but does provide information we can continue to monitor. Testing will continue through the end of the year.


Sewer Maintenance Program- Slip line Layer

Staff has been working to develop a new GIS layer that categorizes sewer infrastructure by material type and helps visually distinguish between sewer mains constructed with

PVC, those rehabilitated through slip lining, and clay pipes scheduled for future slip lining. (A map is included on the next page.)

Between 2020 and 2025, the City installed approximately 15,000 linear feet of cured-inplace pipe (CIPP) at an estimated cost of \$600,000. Since the implementation of this project, the number of sewer mains requiring monthly maintenance has decreased from 17 to just 1. Sewer backups have also significantly declined, demonstrating the effectiveness of the rehabilitation program.

Approximately 30,000 linear feet of clay sewer main remain to be lined, with an estimated cost of \$1.2 million to complete the work.
