Christmas Tree Drop Off

Smithville Lake hosts the annual Christmas Tree drop off at Little Platte Park by Shelter 1. Trees should be free of tinsel, ornaments and tree bags before being dropped off. There are signs to direct you to the dropoff site. The drop off site will be open daily beginning December 26 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. until Jan. 31. The Christmas trees will be distributed to areas around the park and serve as mulch or habitats for fish, birds and other small wildlife. Little Platte Park is located on the west side of the lake and can be accessed by from 169 Highway north to Northeast 180th Street. 180th Street will take you directly into Little Platte Park then follow the signs. Citizen Education Against Scams & Exploitation Presentation

Scams targeting older adults are on the rise and are costing seniors big money. The average victim of elder fraud lost \$33,915 due to these crimes in 2023. Snow Routes

The City of Smithville has established prioritized snow routes to ensure effective and efficient road clearing. For instance, main roads, arterials, and school routes are prioritized first, allowing safe travel for emergency vehicles and essential road users. Residential roads are generally cleared after the primary routes have been fully opened.

Clay County Senior Real Estate Property Tax Relief

Snowplow Tips

1. Plow with Traffic Flow: When clearing your driveway, push the snow in the same direction as traffic. This helps keep snow from being pushed back into your driveway when the street is plowed.

2. Clear a Pocket Before Your Driveway: Create a small cleared area or "pocket" along the curb before your driveway. This pocket will catch some of the snow from street plows, reducing the amount pushed back into your driveway entrance.

3. Keep Vehicles Off the Street: Whenever possible, park vehicles in your driveway or garage during snow events. This allows snowplows to clear streets more effectively and prevents your vehicle from being damaged or buried by plowed snow.

4. Watch for Plows and Stay Clear: Snowplows are large and have limited visibility. Maintain a safe distance from plows, especially when they're actively clearing your street.


