4. Emerald Ridge Park and Playground Design:

In September 2023, this Committee provided the first feedback regarding the initial park and playground designs. Athor and Kompan took the feedback and updated their designs before our October meeting. That meeting was canceled due to attendance. Feedback was asked for over email instead. Again, the feedback was sent back to the two companies, and they updated their designs.

On January 16, 2024, Staff held a public meeting for Emerald Ridge Playground and park design for the Emerald Ridge neighborhood and surrounding areas. It was hosted at the Smithville Senior Center between 5:30 PM - 7:00 PM. The neighborhood got a door hanging notifying them of this meeting. We also posted on Next Door for them and the surrounding subdivisions to join and provide feedback online. We had two families attend the in-person public meeting, one family from the Emerald Ridge neighborhood. There were no comments online.

On January 25, 2024, The Committee met to review all comments received and look into making any changes to the designs based on the comments received. The Committee provided the following feedback after reviewing the public comments:

Athco Committee Feedback:

- -More equipment for 2.5-5-year-olds.
- -Add more interactive boards/equipment.
- -Add swings.
- -Look for an alternative to the We-Go-Round.
- -Get rid of some of the play features on the main structure and add more sensory elements.

Kompan Committee Feedback:

- -New style for the shade structure.
- -Add swings.
- -Get rid of some of the play features on the main structure and add a different play element to it.

Staff was asked to look into adding a restroom and ask the Board of Alderman for more funds for both designs. The committee decided to not move forward with the restroom at this time.

The staff took the feedback provided and met with each design company to make the necessary changes that would be within budget. Both companies have provided updated designs that are within the current budget.

On February 22, 2024, each design company provided a presentation at the meeting. The committee provided the following feedback.

Athco:

Forward think for shade in the future, reduce walking path, remove chimes for sensory boards, make sure mounds are not moveable, the addition of 2.5-5-year-old structure, and add a friendship swing.

Kompan:

Rework the walking path and concrete to save cost.

Both companies have provided a final design to be voted on. Each company provided a final presentation and allowed questions.








Kompan:

Kompan presented their final presentation. He mentioned that he focused on reducing the concrete work by 42%, moving the basketball court closer, and moving the shelter to the west side. The Committee asked if the soccer goal could be faced the other way, if a baby swing could be added and if the project was within budget. Kopan mentioned that they would change the direction of the goal, they may not be able to add the swing and they were within budget.

Athco:

Athco presented their final presentation. Some of the highlights they presented were adding the 2.5-5 area and the multiple swings. He mentioned the Committee felt strongly about this age group and swings and wanted to ensure this was met. They mentioned to the Committee that they could take out the circle swing and add shade to the main structure if they would like. The Committee said they were in favor of this change. The Committee also asked if the trail from the playground to the basketball court could not come through the shelter and if a baby swing could be added. Athco mentioned this could be done.

Kompan:

Kompan presented their final presentation. He mentioned that he focused on reducing the concrete work by 42%, moving the basketball court closer, and moving the shelter to the west side. The Committee asked if the soccer goal could be faced the other way if a baby swing could be added, and if the project was within budget. Kopan mentioned that they would change the direction of the goal, they may not be able to add the swing and they were within budget.

Recommendation Vote:

The Mayor made a motion to discuss Emerald Ridge Park and Playground Design. Kyle seconded the motion. Dani opened the discussion to the rest of the Committee to gather input. The Committee discussed their feedback as a group and felt they were ready to vote. The final recommendation was a 6-0 vote for the Athco Park and Playground design.

Emerald Ridge Park and Playground Update:

On May 7, 2024, The Board of Alderman approved the Parks and Recreation Committee's recommendation for the Athco Park and Playground design. Athco was made aware, and they have begun scheduling the construction.
