Citizen Satisfaction Survey

As outlined in the FY2025 Budget, the City has partnered with ETC Institute to conduct a community-wide citizen satisfaction survey. The survey instrument, developed by City staff and ETC Institute, includes questions from past Smithville surveys to allow for benchmarking, along with new questions aimed at measuring resident satisfaction and identifying priorities for future projects and programs.

Surveys will be mailed to all identifiable households in Smithville in October. Residents can complete the survey by returning the paper form to ETC Institute or by using the online link provided in the mailer.

A minimum of 300 responses will provide statistically valid City-wide results, with a margin of error of +/- 5.6% at the 96% confidence level. ETC Institute is expected to present the analysis to the Board of Aldermen in early 2026.

We encourage all residents to complete their household survey. Your feedback is essential in helping the City measure satisfaction with services and set priorities for the future.

Instead of raking leaves to the curb, consider these options:

- Mulch them with your mower to create natural fertilizer for your lawn.
- Compost them for use in gardens and landscaping.
- Bag them for collection. The City's contract with GFL Environmental includes yard waste pickup.
